VILLAGE OF HARRISON BOARD MEETING MINUTES 07/26/16

A regular meeting of the Village of Harrison board was called to order on Tuesday, July 26, 2016 at 7:00pm in the Harrison Municipal Building with President Jim Salm presiding. After the Pledge of Allegiance was recited, roll was called.

Public Comments

Joe & Lisa Romenesko, Blackoak St, spoke in favor of approving the request to place a fence in the drainage easement on their property. They do not believe it was affect the drainage flow in any way.

Don Mielke, State Park Road, asked the board to reconsider the \$200 solar energy permit fee. He urged the board to be progressive in terms of encouraging others to invest in solar energy and live more "off the grid."

District Attorney Nicholas Bolz asked the board for continued support in the upcoming elections. He highlighted the DA's office commitment in protecting the public, supporting victims' rights, and being fiscally responsible.

Items removed from Consent Agenda- Discharge of Firearms application for Bodway

Clerk J. Weyenberg submitted correspondence from Brian Tungate, Director of Parks and Rec for the City of Menasha. The city objects to the request due to safety concerns with their 5.25 acre city park being directly adjacent to Mr. Bodway's property. Manager T. Parish explained that Wis State Statutes prohibit discharge of firearms within 100 yards of homes and 220 yards of parks so those rules can be enforced with or without our approval of the application. Motion by Trustee Moore with second by Trustee Hietpas to approve the request for the discharge of firearms waiver. Motion to approve carried 5-1 with Trustee Nelson opposed.

Request to place fence in easement at N9088 Blackoak St

Property owners have requested to place a fence within a drainage easement along the rear property line. It would be a 42" high, open-type of fence. Motion by Trustee Nelson with second by Trustee Hietpas to approve the request. Motion to approve carried 6-0.

Request to use amplification at Darboy Community Park rental on 08/27/16

Renter is asking that a 4-person band be allowed to play and use amplification from 4:00-6:30pm on 08/27/16. Motion by Trustee Moore with second by Trustee Sprangers to allow the amplification during the times requested. Motion to approve carried 6-0.

Recommendation from Park Committee to go to RFP for Park Design

The wetland delineation for the property on Manitowoc Rd is completed and the next step is to create a park design. Motion by Trustee Nelson with second by Trustee Moore to approve the request to send out an RFP for park design. Motion to approve carried 6-0.

Add silt fence fee to building permit for new subdivisions

The village installed silt fencing in Parker Farms II to help ease erosion control problems. The project cost was \$4,250.00 and staff recommended adding \$160.00 to the building permit for this subdivision to cover the expenses. Motion by Trustee Lisowe with second by Trustee Moore to approve the additional \$160 fee to permits in Parker Farms II. Motion to approve carried 6-0.
